- Total Homelessness within the Continuum of Care (LA CoC) increased by 8,376 persons (+18%) between 2011 and 2013
  - 73% of this increase occurred within the City of Los Angeles (LA City)
  - Total Homelessness within LA City increased by 26%
- LA City comprises 55% of the LA CoC Homeless population in 2013 vs. 52% in 2011

- Total Homelessness in Los Angeles increased by 6,143 persons between 2011 and 2013
  - The Hidden Homeless accounted for 68% of this increase
  - Largest increases in CD 2 (+253%) and CD 14 (+149%)
- Decreases were observed only in CD 5 (-34%), CD 8 (-2%), CD 9 (-56%) and CD 15 (-16%)

- Overall increases were observed for both Single Adults (+39%) and Unaccompanied Youth (+118%) populations
- Family Members decreased overall (-22%) with CD 8 exhibiting the largest decrease (-804)
- Largest Single Adults increase was in CD 14 (+3,007), and CD 9 posted the largest decrease (-2,775)

- The City of Los Angeles reflects the overall trend of decreased Sheltered and increased Unsheltered Homelessness
- Likely contributing factors to these increases:
  - Continuing, persistent recession and high unemployment
  - The loss of critical resources available under ARRA, Homeless Prevention and Rapid Re-Housing funds
  - Lack of adequate affordable housing coupled with rising rents
  - Prison realignment strategies
  - Continued use of CDBG funding formulas that heavily weight age of housing
  - In-migration from surrounding areas

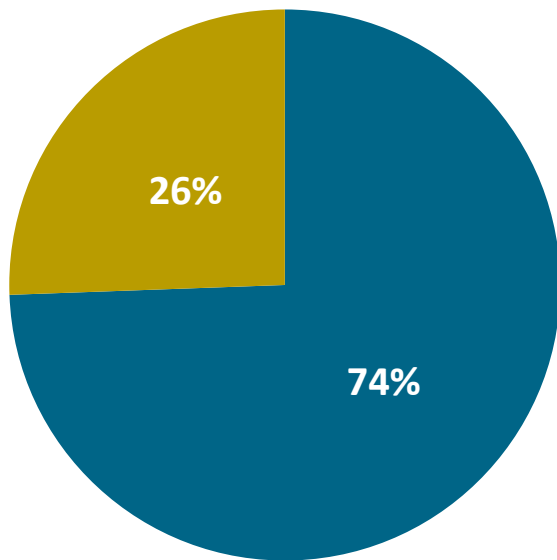

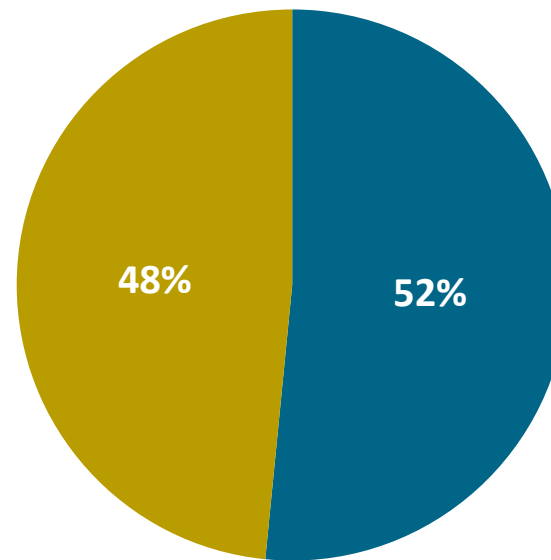

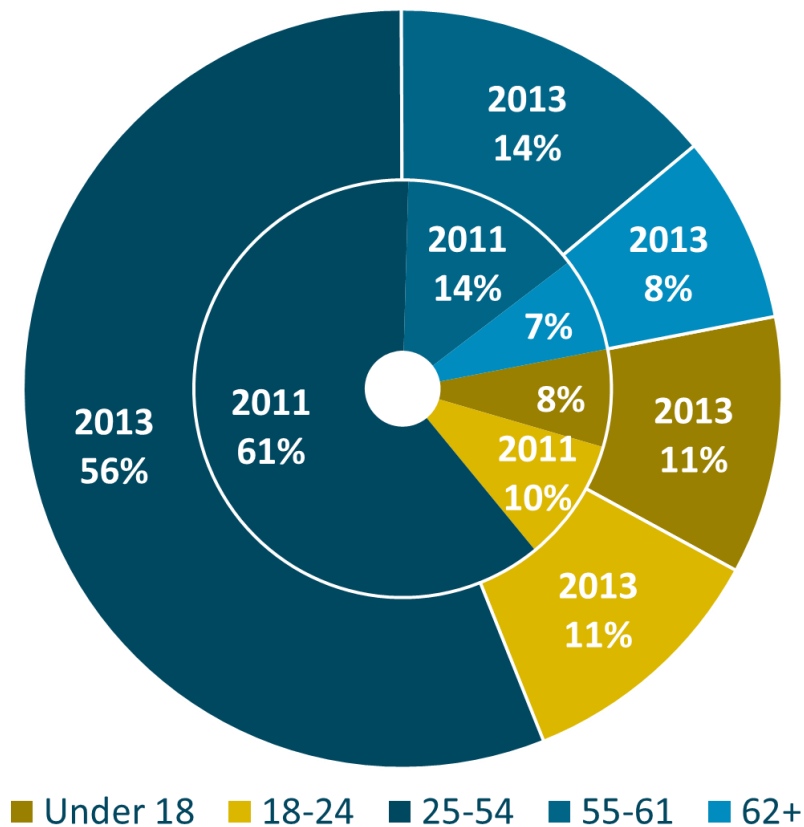

- Largest decrease in 25-54

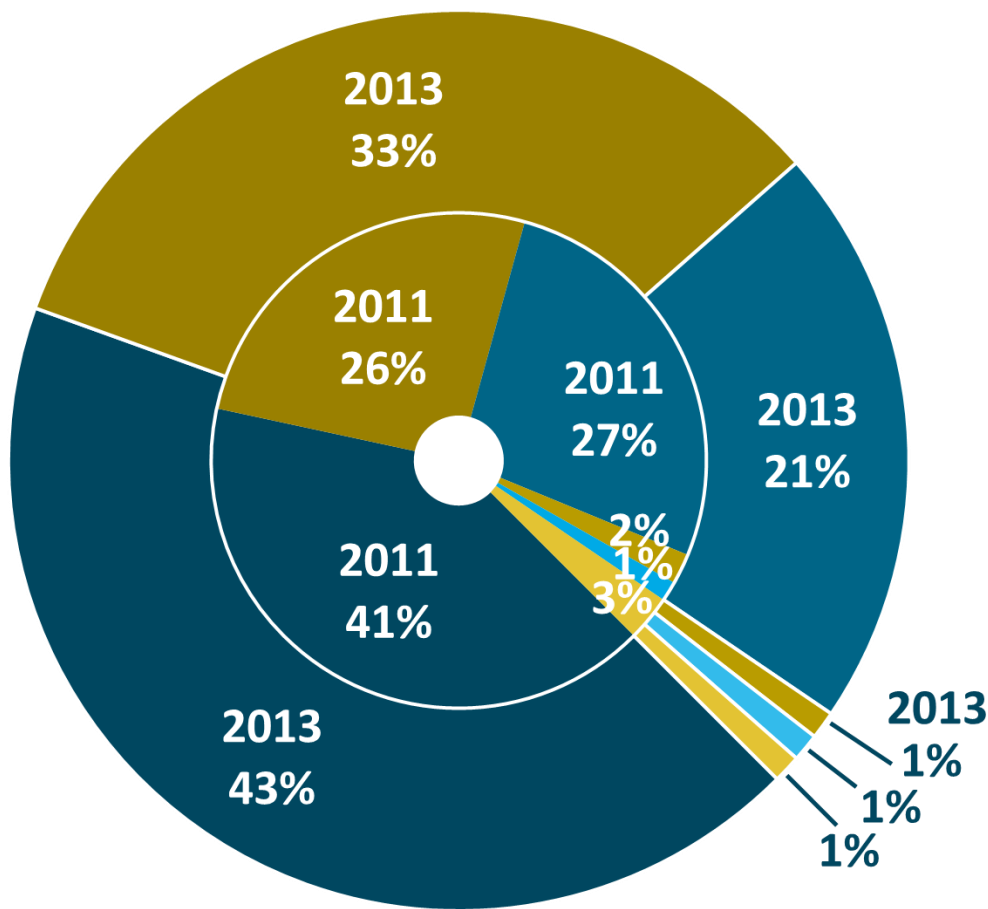
